

# Father's Role in a Child's Life

## 7th Sunday

In a traditional Chuukese family, the Father has the lead role in a child's life. He has the authority and power to discipline the child. Father is the head of the household and the breadwinner of the family. His primary role is to provide for his family, and to pass down culture and tradition to his children.

It is a known custom that man is esteemed higher than a woman in Chuukese society. This translates to more evident display of respect and compliance on the part of the children to the father than to the mother.

When fathers embrace their responsibilities the family will succeed.



- ★ Whether they say it or not, your children look up to you for support.
- ★ Ask about how they are doing in school, who their friends are, what their favorite subject is, etc.
- ★ Make time for your child.
- ★ Discuss with them about the consequences of using drugs, alcohol, skipping school, etc.
- ★ Talk to them about your faith, culture, traditions, history and legends.
- ★ Talk to them on how to be successful living in Hawaii.
